During a time when many families lost income due to COVID-19, this program provided a valuable resource for those who needed to paint the exterior of their homes. Our amazing volunteers stepped up to help those who needed their yards cleaned up, small items repaired for code compliance or needed major assistance due to significant safety issues. Other Lakewoodite's became first-time Tool Box clients, tackling items on their to-do list. For many, the Housing Outreach Program has become their go-to for home repair assistance and resources.

Over the course of the year, we worked to keep small businesses connected by supporting three business associations and started a monthly citywide call for any business owner to join. We partnered with the City of Lakewood to help small businesses gain access to CARES Act funding that enabled businesses to remain open and keep their teams employed. As a result, we have met so many incredible people who have risked it all to live out their dream of running their own business and we are eager to strengthen and support those relationships.

Over the past year, our community events are what kept us going. The joy and connection that they brought for so many residents truly warmed our hearts. We all needed something to look forward to on Friday nights, so we brought our Front Porch Concert Series into the comfort and safety of folks' homes virtually. Lakewood is the epicenter of dog-life in Northeast Ohio and that reputation gained even more traction with the popularity of pandemic dogs. Although we could not gather in-person, we were inspired to continue the spirit of the Spooky Pooch Parade. Families and pets dressed up in their most creative costumes for a chance to be part of the Spooky Pooch calendar. Thanks to so many community partners, Light Up Lakewood, an event filled with traditions, continued virtually in its own unique way. We broadcasted the lighting ceremony complete with Buddy the Elf and Santa; hosted a mini-parade across the entire city that brought so many people out to their driveways and sidewalks despite a rainstorm; and broadcasted many of our favorite traditions for nine straight evenings to keep the holiday spirit alive!

All of you — our board members, donors, community partners and supporters — have been there with us every step of the way. Your continued support keeps us motivated. It fills our hearts with gratitude and helps us focus on what's important, the residents and small businesses in this amazing community.

Everything we do comes down to helping people. As we reflect on the year that saw us adapt and tackle challenges LakewoodAlive couldn't have foreseen, I am proud to be part of a team that day in and day out is #HereToPersevere. Thank you for being part of our team.

LakewoodAlive administers a Housing Outreach Program which connects residents with resources to maintain the community's aging housing stock. These services are designed to offer a one-stop place for residents to ensure they are able to live in healthy and safe housing:

- Working one-on-one with low-moderate income residents, many of whom are senior citizens, to connect them to resources, as well as to volunteer labor to complete necessary home maintenance.
- The Lakewood Pride Fund, a program that leverages a collection of funds to secure home repair loans for families who otherwise might not have access to conventional bank financing.
- The Knowing Your Home educational series, which focuses on sustainability and maintenance best practices empowering homeowners to tackle necessary home repairs and improvements.





# HOUSING OUTREACH PROGRAM

## Paint Lakewood

- The Paint Lakewood Program, supported by the City of Lakewood, is a grant program for low-moderate income residents to assist with obtaining affordable exterior house painting.

## Paint Program

Total Projects: 12

Total Improvements: \$71,127



- All 12 clients served through the Paint Lakewood Program are low-moderate income (80% or less than area median income)
- 5 of 12 clients were seniors or 42%
- 6 of 12 were female heads of household or 50%
- 5 of 12 were single female senior heads of household or 42%



## Birdtown Picnic

- The Birdtown Picnic, in its 7th year, is designed to bring the neighborhood together to celebrate our community's rich diversity. This event is a program of the LakewoodAlive Housing Outreach Community Engagement Program. The Community Engagement Program develops community outreach and engagement initiatives for homeowners and residents to help cultivate a sense of pride and ownership.



## Lakewood Tool Box

- The Lakewood Tool Box, a tool lending library, offers community members an affordable and educational option for borrowing tools that are essential for completing home repairs.

Throughout the ongoing pandemic, social media remained a huge asset in telling LakewoodAlive's story and keeping the community connected. Throughout this time, we relied heavily on social media to highlight our work and provide updates about our large-scale events that have become traditions for many residents. We approached our popular events season with a hybrid schedule, hosting Loving Lakewood and Front Porch Concert series virtually and returning in-person for Lakewood Summer Meltdown 5K, Spooky Pooch Parade and Light Up Lakewood. Throughout this ongoing and ever-changing time of uncertainty, our social media outlets played a crucial role in quickly and effectively sharing updates to our community.







The Downtown Lakewood Historic District project was completed in partnership with the City of Lakewood, with grant funding through the State of Ohio's Historic Preservation Office and extensive research and investigation by Lakewood firm Placemark Collaborative. The nomination made its way through state and federal approval in the fall of 2020.

The Downtown Lakewood Historic District is now included on the National Register of Historic Places, deeming it worthy of preservation for its historic buildings.

The district includes an area from just west of Bunts Road to midway between Hall and Ethel Avenues, Warren Road from Detroit Avenue to almost Franklin Boulevard, and a number of apartment buildings located adjacent to Detroit Avenue on side streets.

The 105 buildings in the Lakewood Downtown Historic District trace Lakewood's development from a thriving agricultural community through its development as a streetcar era suburb, as well as the reinvestment projects in downtown during the 1960s and early 1970s.

"We are thrilled to announce the completion of the Downtown Lakewood Historic District project which has been in the works since 2016 when the Ohio Historic Preservation Office Staff visited to determine if a district was viable," said LakewoodAlive Executive Director Ian Andrews. "This listing now unlocks state and federal historic tax credits for building owners in an effort to further support investment in our historic commercial building stock."

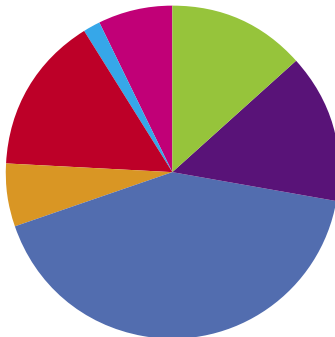

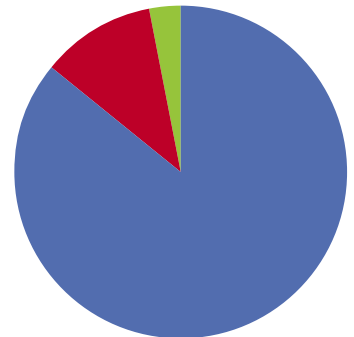

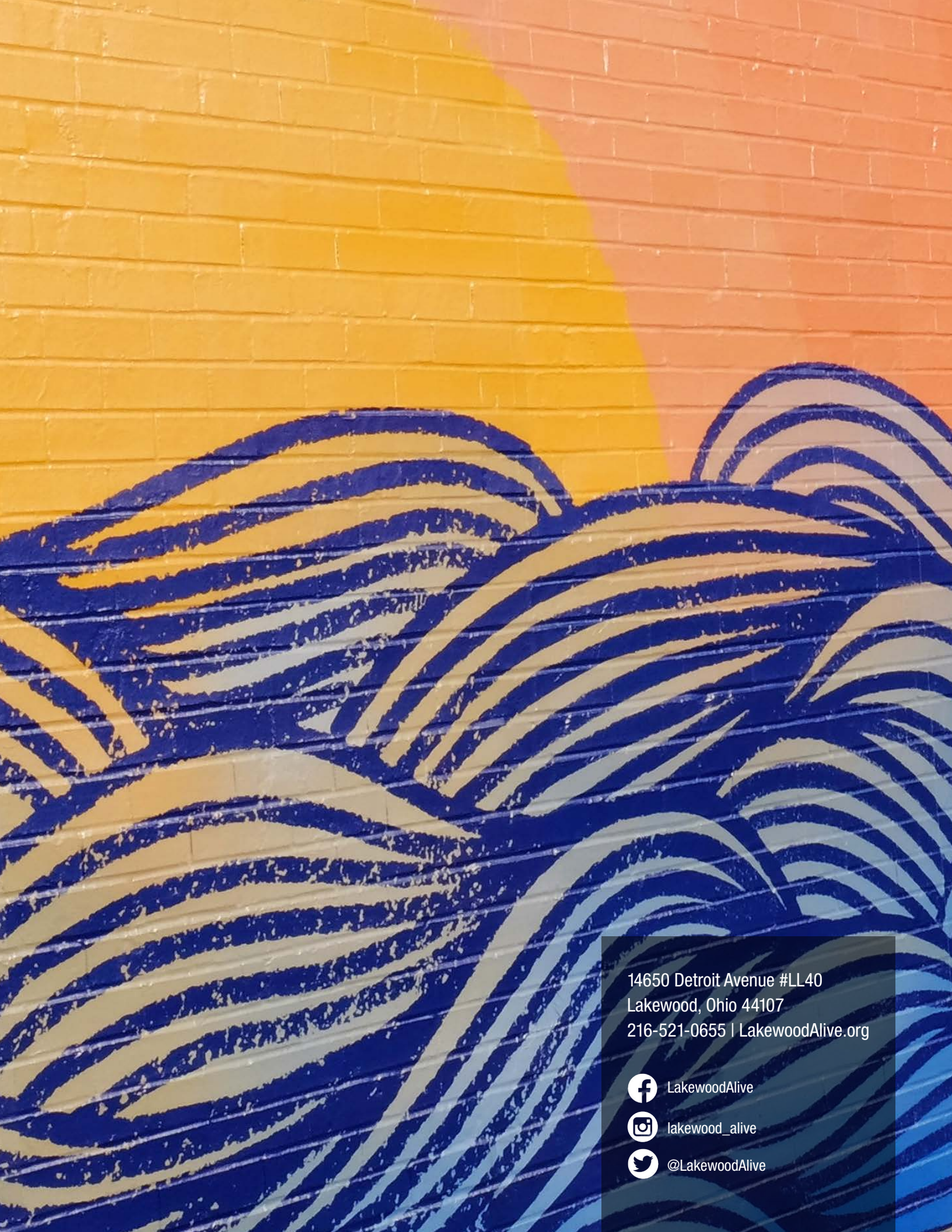
